PREDATORY PUBLISHERS

Predatory Journals

"Predatory Journals" use **aggressive advertising** and **pretend professionalism** in order to trick researchers into publishing articles for a fee, but do not organize any or **completely inadequate quality** assurance measures.

Predatory conferences

Similar activities are pursued by Predatory Conference Organizers, who organize **dubious conferences** and invite researchers to participate and take part in these events.

 - Journalists pretending to be academics submitted non-sense scientific contributions to publishers and conferences organizators

Salvia Hispanica L (Chia Seeds) as Brain Superfood – How Seeds Increase Intelligence

Abstract

The influence of nutrition on cognitive abilities is undisputed in academic literature. Omega-3 fatty acids in particular delivered convincing results in several studies. In recent years chia seeds (Salvia Hispanica L) are becoming increasingly popular in Europe as well. In a trial the authors divided the study participants into two groups: an intervention group and a control group. The participants of the intervention group consumed a daily dose of 5 grams chia seeds over a time period of 21 days.

In total, the test group that participated in the intervention performed significantly better in the retest than the comparison group. They improved their verbal intelligence and enhanced their ability in problem solving. Insofar, the classification of Sabita Hispanica L as a superfood, respectively brain superfood, is sejentifically justified.

- Results
 - Publishers classified as dubious accepted publications and contributions (e.g. OMICS, ConferenceSeries)

- → the term "fake science" became popular
- → predatory publishing = fake science …?



Reputable Publishers

- Quality control (e.g. peer review)
- Editorial services (layout, marketing)
- → Payment for services

Predatory Publishers

- Quality is irrelevant
- Publishing services (e.g. peer review) inadequate or not provided at all
- → Payment without services



→ Predatory publishing does not necessarily mean fake science



The dangers of publishing with Predatory Publisher

- Publishing services (e.g. peer review) inadequate or not provided at all
- Damage to scientific reputation
- Access (long-term archiving) is not guaranteed
- Low visibility of publications (e.g. fake indices)
- Withdrawal of articles often not possible or subject to high fees
 - → Articles may be published even without approval



Why do some scientists still take the risk to publish "predatory" intentionally?

- Publications are necessary for vita (publish or perish)
- Easy access to "scientific publishing"
- Publication is possible despite rejection in reputable journals
- "Win-Win" situation (publication for money)

What about publishing without knowledge?

Dubious publishers are often recognized too late



Big damage to science or a marginal problem?

- Are publications in Predatory Journals a big deal?
 - International publications of dubious journals rose from 53 000 manuscripts (2010) to more than 400 000 (2014) (Shen C et al., 2015)
 - Around 1.3 % of German scientists (according to Science Media Center Germany)


What about Helmholtz association?

Big damage to sience or a marginal problem?




Sample investigation for the publishing house SCIRP (n= 17.500 articles)

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




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- Frontiers in Life Science is published by Taylor & Francis since 2011

- → "Hijacked Journal"

- Predatory Publishers are not always easy to identify
 - Publishing/participating without knowledge is possible

- → Predatory Journals/Conferences" know how to fish for contributions
- → How can Predatory Publishers be identified?






SERVICES OF THE CENTRAL LIBRARY
