Stakeholder-specific goals of the Open Access Monitor Germany

National and regional autorities gain a detailed overview of the situation in their area of responsbility

Funders may prioritize and evaluate their programms

Institutions may identify scientifc areas where they can increase their efforts

Libraries may negotiate fact-based agreements for the transition to Open Access and switch funds from subscription budgets to publication funds.

Authors may optimize their respectice publication behaviour.

Information scientists get research data for studies on scholarly publishing.



Lessons Learned and Outlook

- Demand is beyond expectations: institutions, consortia, funders
- Data providers (Clarivate, Elsevier) became interested
- Normalized data are necessary, but tedious to provide
- Subscription data are the weakest point; integration of additional ERM systems (ALMA, FOLIO) is planned
- Integration of non-OA publication fees is in preparation
- Integration of additional document types (books, proceedings) is considered
- User interface in English language is in preparation
- We are open for international cooperations
