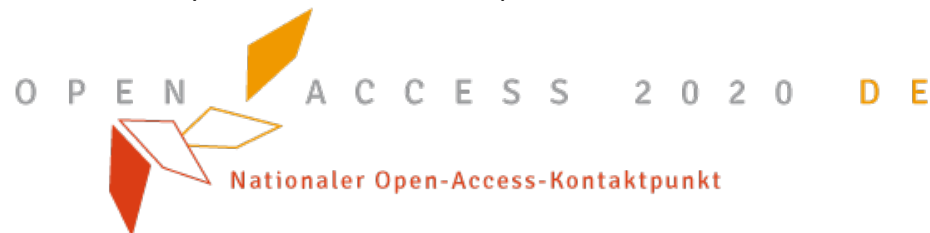

Institutions may identify scientific areas where they can increase their efforts

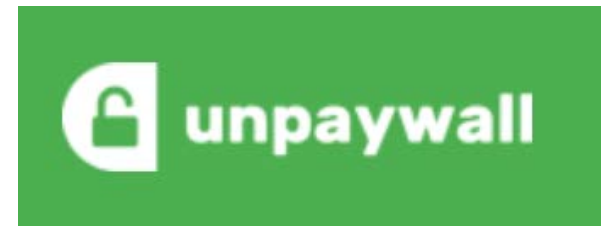
Libraries may negotiate fact-based agreements for the transition to Open Access and switch funds from subscription budgets to publication funds.

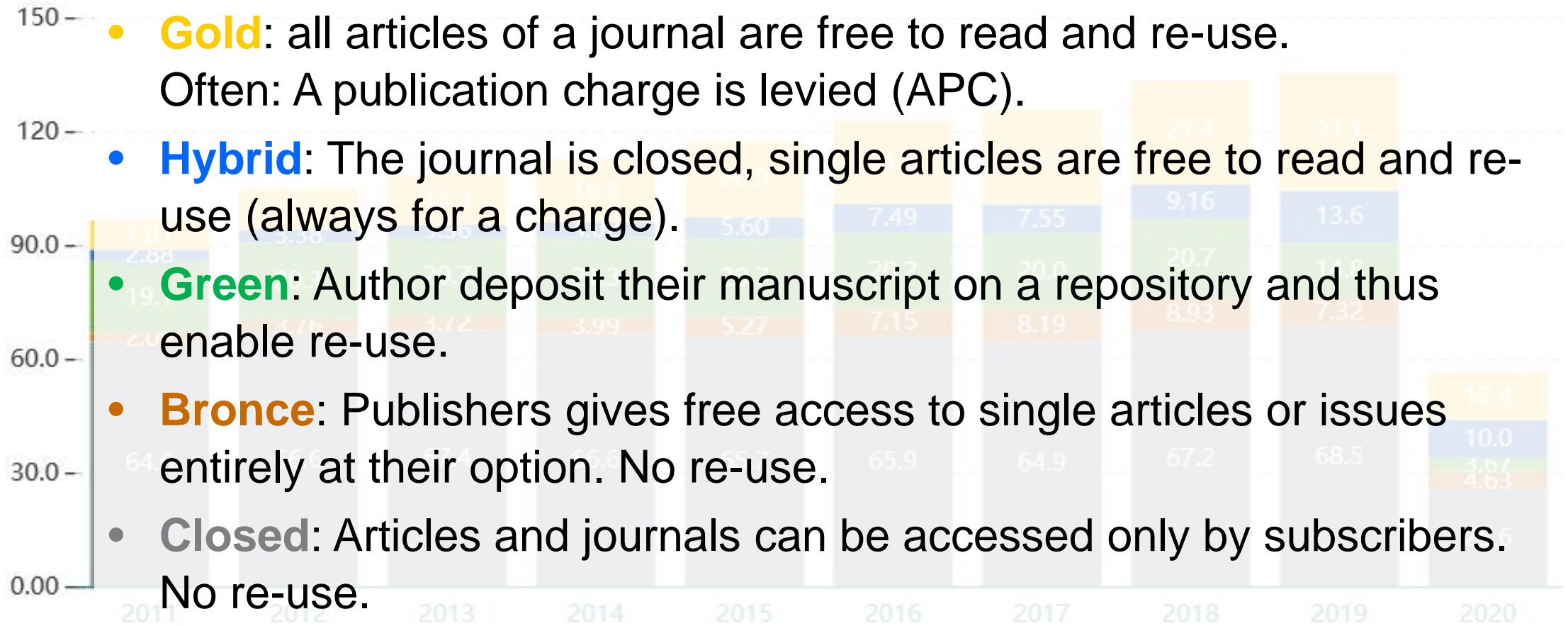

Lessons Learned and Outlook

- Demand is beyond expectations: institutions, consortia, funders
- Data providers (Clarivate, Elsevier) became interested
- Normalized data are necessary, but tedious to provide
- Subscription data are the weakest point; integration of additional ERM systems (ALMA, FOLIO) is planned
- Integration of non-OA publication fees is in preparation
- Integration of additional document types (books, proceedings) is considered
- User interface in English language is in preparation
- We are open for international cooperations
